

QUICK REFERENCE - ANIMAL HEALTH (GENERAL) REGULATION

The Animal Health (General) Regulation is a new administrative regulation under the *Animal Health Act*.

Highlights include:

- 1) “Authorized Persons” are designated for the purposes of the information collection, use and disclosure provisions of the *Animal Health Act* (AHA), building on the list already contained in the Act;
- 2) The identification that Agriculture and Forestry inspectors are required to carry is prescribed;
- 3) The appeal form to be used when an individual appeals a determination of the expenses occurred in carrying out a quarantine order, surveillance order or control order, as per AHA Section 46(1)(a); and
- 4) The penalties for the Reportable and Notifiable Diseases (RAND) Regulation; these penalties are located in the Animal Health (General) regulation for administrative reasons.
